What are Lexia Lessons?




- * **Speaking Practice:** These lessons help students practice engagement with oral language discourse through the use of language frames that engage students in academic conversations right away, and help them make sense of and properly use grammatical structures across multiple contexts.
- * **Listening Practice:** These lessons offer students additional opportunities to practice targeted skills in listening comprehension with select listening passages in a collaborative manner.






Where can Lexia Lessons be found?
