
Overview

The Speaking Practice Anchor Charts were designed to provide learners with portable language supports that can be used in a variety of academic and social settings. When used in conjunction with the Lexia English program, the Speaking Practice Anchor Charts build students' oral language discourse through the use of language frames. Practice with language frames engages students in academic conversations and helps them make sense of and properly use grammatical structures across multiple contexts.













How can Speaking Practice Anchor Charts be used?

They can be printed in black and white or color, or projected digitally.

Usage Tips:

- The subject-matter focus for the language frame is listed in the upper right corner, but the language frames can be used across content areas.
- Speaking Practice Anchor Charts can serve as a portable visual reference for students as they generalize skills into new settings. They can be folded to offer different levels of support.
- Educators can encourage students to use the language frames they've been practicing in conversations with others in their homes or in their community.
