

Lexia[®] English Classroom Implementation Plan


Lexia® English Language Development™ is an adaptive blended learning speaking and listening program that supports students' English language development through academic conversations.

Lexia English follows an adaptive blended learning (ABL) model that ensures differentiated, personalized instruction for each student. This model requires implementing three essential components:

- · Independent, student-driven learning
- Ongoing data monitoring to drive instructional priorities
- Teacher-led instruction

This guide will support you to set goals and plan for the successful implementation of each of these three components in your classroom.

Consider completing your plan as a collaborative team (e.g., grade level, instructional coach). This document may be updated as often as needed as you monitor and manage your Lexia English implementation.
