The goal-setting process is a great opportunity to empower Emergent Bilinguals and promote a growth mindset. Students can participate in tracking progress, reflecting on successful efforts, and choosing areas in which they'd like to improve.

- **Tip 2 Partner with students** by listening and ensuring that they have a voice in setting goals and tracking progress. Encourage students to focus on learning and growth, not just performance.
- **Tip 3 Motivate and engage students** by being aware of individual needs, likes, and dislikes. Create classroom rewards and incentives to celebrate student milestones.
- **Tip 4 Follow up** by scheduling regular student-teacher or peer conferences. Support students in developing good habits to consistently monitor and track their own progress.
- **Tip 5 Build positive school-to-home connections** by sharing student progress with families.

Times can vary depending on an individual student's goals. You can support students in deciding what the usage time goal will be. The following are recommended times: For students in K-2, the recommended usage is 10-15 minutes, three times per week. For students in grades 3-6, the recommended usage is 15-20 minutes, three times per week. To maximize the benefits students get from using Lexia English, the total weekly recommended usage of the online program (30-45 min for grades K-2; 45-60 min for grades 3-6) should be met on a weekly basis.

The student's encounter target is the number of encounters a student should aim to complete based on their individual target times. An encounter takes approximately 19-27 minutes to complete. A student in grades K-2 following the recommended usage times should aim to complete about 1-2 encounters per week. A student in grades 3-6 following the recommended usage times should aim to complete 2-3 encounters per week.
